EVENT TIMES

- 9:00 a.m.** Main Entrance and main parking lot at 6000 Shelburne Road (US Route 7) open on April 8, 2024.
- 10:00 a.m.** Admission to the Museum grounds starts.
- 2:14 p.m.** Partial eclipse begins.
- 3:26 p.m.** Totality begins.
- 3:29 p.m.** Totality ends.
- 4:37 p.m.** Partial ends.
- 5:00 p.m.** Event concludes, and Museum grounds close.

OPEN BUILDINGS

Carousel: working 1920s carousel.

Electra Havemeyer Webb Memorial Building: European paintings including Impressionist paintings.

Pizzagalli Center for Art and Education: Children's art activity (downstairs). Ticketed fundraising event in auditorium.

Pleissner Gallery: Paintings by Ogden Pleissner.

Round Barn: Carriages.

Stagecoach Inn: American folk art including trade signs, weathervanes and paintings.

Weathervane Café: Food and beverages.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Tickets are nonrefundable, but may be transferred to another person via email.

Eclipse view glasses are included with each ticket.



Travel around the Museum campus will be on foot. There will be no shuttle service.

You may return to your vehicle after entering the Museum. Please stop at Admissions Desk to get a sticker that allows return entrance.

Photography and video (for personal use only) are welcome on the Museum grounds.

Tripods and selfie sticks are prohibited indoors but welcome outdoors.

Pets are not permitted on the Museum grounds. Service animals are welcome.

Shelburne Museum is a smoke-free campus. Smoking is not permitted anywhere on the Museum grounds.

Backpacks and strollers are restricted in some buildings.

The safety and well-being of our visitors and staff is of the utmost importance. To ensure a secure venue for all, the possession of firearms, fireworks, explosives, incendiary devices, knives, or weapons of any kind is prohibited on Shelburne Museum's property.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Can I access the big steamboat Ticonderoga?

The 220-foot steamboat Ticonderoga is reserved for a fundraising event that requires special tickets.

Are tripods, telescopes, and cameras allowed?

Outdoors, yes. Tripods are prohibited in some exhibition buildings.

Can I bring in food and drink?

Our Weathervane Café will be open with snacks, food, and beverages. You may also bring in food. No glass bottles. Large coolers are discouraged.

What about folding chairs and blankets?

We recommend you bring portable folding chairs and/or blankets for viewing. Be aware the ground may be wet, frozen and/or snow covered.

Can I bring my pet along?

No pets. If you are visiting with a service animal, please consult with Museum staff.
